



Walt Disney World Monorail System

Walt Disney World Monorail System (WDM) is a mass transit system located at Walt Disney World Resort in Orlando, Florida. It is the largest monorail system in the world, with a total length of 10.5 miles. The system consists of four lines: the Resort Line, the Express Line, the Skyway Line, and the International Drive Line. The Resort Line is the longest and most heavily used, connecting the four main resorts: Disney's Contemporary Resort, Disney's Grand Floridian Resort & Spa, Disney's Polynesian Resort, and Disney's Caribbean Beach Resort. The Express Line connects the Contemporary Resort and the Grand Floridian Resort & Spa. The Skyway Line connects the Contemporary Resort and the Grand Floridian Resort & Spa. The International Drive Line connects the Contemporary Resort and the Grand Floridian Resort & Spa.

The system is operated by Walt Disney World Transportation & Ticketing. It is a fully automated system, with no conductors or attendants on board. The trains are operated by a central computer system. The system is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Resort Line has a capacity of 2,210 passengers per hour. The Express Line has a capacity of 745 passengers per hour. The Skyway Line has a capacity of 615 passengers per hour. The International Drive Line has a capacity of 9,282 passengers per hour. The system is a popular mode of transportation for guests, providing a convenient and scenic way to travel between the resorts.
